# Service & Giving Volunteer of the Month... Bruce Jayne



Bruce Jayne enjoyed his previous experiences with hospice during his chaplaincy tenure in Charleston so, when he and his wife moved to Saluda fulltime in 2018, it was a natural fit for him to explore possible volunteer opportunities at Four Seasons Hospice. He was impressed by its longevity (one of the first hospices in US), its scope (13 counties in its service area), and the professionalism of the staff (evidenced right away in his 3-day volunteer orientation training).

He serves in two ways: direct visitation with patients receiving palliative care or hospice care (usually in an assisted living or skilled nursing facility) and weekly respite care in the patient's home to permit the caregiver to be out of the home for three hours to take care of personal needs. His service may involve serious (or not-so-serious) conversation (by phone during the pandemic), or singing with a minimally-communicative patient after learning that he loved to sing, or just providing a loving presence.

Bruce considers it a genuine privilege to be involved in the lives of people nearing their end of life. The opportunity to relate to their family members as well has been very satisfying also. 

#### Joel Helfand in Benefit Concert for 47th Henderson County Hunger Walk


Where: Fellowship Hall of First Congregational United Church of Christ Acclaimed musician Joel Helfand will present a free-will
